Explanation of Taxes.

VILLAGE OF LUMSDEN BEACH

June 1968

Dear Cottage Owner:-

Enclosed with your tax notice is a copy of the Financial Statement and the Revenue Balance for 1967. We would ask that you examine it and, should you have any questions, we would attempt to answer them at the Annual Meeting.

Incidentally, the Annual Meeting date has been set for Saturday, July 6th., at 7:30 in the Lodge. As in past years, it will be preceded by the Picnic and Sports Day.

Foot races will be held, at the golf course, commencing around ten o'clock. Sand Castle judging will take place, on the beach, around two o'clock and will be followed by the swimming races.

The picnic will be held, in the Park, around five-thirty and all families are urged to come out and join in the gathering.

In your tax notice you will note an increase of three dollars per cottage under the heading of Sanitation, Water and Recreation. This three dollar increase was adopted by council to provide funds for the recreation committee to carry out their work. While it will not provide all the funds that they require, it will be a big help to them. The three dollar assessment automatically pays the golf fees for each cottage and thus permits every owner, as well as their guests, to use the facilities.

Incidentally, the balance of your assessment in this category is made up as follows....\$4.00 per cottage for garbage pick up, \$3.00 per cottage for water (general assessment) and \$2.00 for each water outlet.

The mill rates, and assessments, have remained the same for another year but we must face a re-assessment by the Government Dept. of Municipal Affairs this fall. This re-assessment has been urged, for some time, but your council has hesitated to have it done because of the increase that will likely occur to the school tax. However, it is compulsory and this fall will see the assessors reviewing the beach. Please do everything that you can to help them.

The store is now open and the new operators, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Foster, have a very wide selection of stock. Please give them your support.

NOTICE TO COTTAGERS

The Council of the VILLAGE OF LUMSDEN BEACH requests your cooperation in carrying out the following regulations as it is to the benefit of all.

1. Watering of gardens and lawns from the village water supply will not be allowed on weekends from 6.00 P.M. Friday to 6.00 P.M. Sunday.
2. Water lines must be kept free of brush, rubbish, etc. in order that they may be serviced and repaired.
3. Cut-off valves must be supplied and installed by each cottage owner at the source of supply to his cottage. If this is not done, water may be cut off from the cottage or if a plumber is available a cut-off valve may be installed by the Village and all costs be charged to the cottager.
4. Cottagers must supply and use GARBAGE CANS of metal or plastic fitted with lids and placed on stands or otherwise secured so that they may not be pushed over by animals.
5. In accordance with the Health Department regulations, rubbish must not be allowed to accumulate on private property. Accumulation of rubbish will be removed by the Village if set out for collection before June 15th.
6. The use of FIRE ARMS of any kind including air rifles and air pistols is prohibited in the R.M. of Lumsden except by licensed hunters in the regular hunting season. The Village of Lumsden Beach is included in the above Rural Municipality.
7. The lighting of BONFIRES in the Village area must be restricted to private property or Temple Park. Such fires must be in pits or in fire places of stone or concrete. The fire hazard in the bush or grass becomes extremely high in summer, and no equipment or water is available for fire fighting.
8. Every Nomination for Councillor shall be in writing on the proper form as provided by the Village Act and must be in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer one week prior to Election Day which is the same day and time of our Annual Meeting.
9. Each Nomination paper shall be signed by two electors of the Village, also accepted and signed by the candidate whose signature shall be witnessed.
10. Due notice shall be given all cottagers of the Annual Meeting. Election of Councillors if required will be held at this meeting.
11. Voters eligible to vote shall be
 - a) every person full age of 18 and assessed on the last assessment roll,
 - b) every woman who is the wife and every man who is the husband of a person qualified under clause a).
12. No DOGS shall be allowed on the beach or near the swimming area except those on a leash.

Please note the following:

- a) A motion was passed at the 1964 Annual Meeting that the annual SPORTS DAY and PICNIC be held on the same day as the Annual Meeting and that all cottagers be advised.
- b) Your support of our local STORE for all supplies is requested. Without it there would be great inconvenience to summer residents to drive miles every day for bread and milk.
